Year 12 & Year 13 - Mobile Phones

Maiden Erlegh School (MES), as part of Maiden Erlegh Trust (MET) are committed to providing a calm, focused, and purposeful learning environment where all students can thrive academically, socially and emotionally.

Over recent years, there has been increasing national attention on the impact of mobile phones on learning, concentration, attendance, behaviour and wellbeing. In February 2026 the Department for Education (DfE) released updated legislation relating to mobile phone use in schools instructing schools to prohibit the use of mobile phones throughout the school day in order to minimise disruption, improve behaviour and maximise learning time. This legislation states that “all schools should be mobile phone-free environments by default and that schools should develop a mobile phone policy that prohibits the use of mobile phones and other smart technology with similar functionality to mobile phones throughout the school day, including during lessons, the time between lessons, breaktimes and lunchtime.”

The DfE expects schools to implement a policy whereby students do not have access to their mobile phone throughout the school day including during lessons, the time between lessons, breaktimes and lunchtime.

In response to this legislation, the Children’s Wellbeing and Schools Act 226 (section 36) notes that schools should be phone free from Monday 29 June 2026. We have therefore taken the decision to introduce magnetic signal-blocking phone pouches for students in Years 7 to 11 strengthen the sanctions associated with mobile phone misuse in our schools to ensure we comply with this new legislation. Currently, we are not implementing these magnetic signal-blocking phone pouches for students in Years 12 and 13.

Sixth Form students are permitted to use their phones in lessons (as and if directed by a member of staff), within the Sixth Form block, and in the Sixth Form garden (adjacent to the Sixth Form block). However, Sixth Form students will be subject to the sanctions below if they use their phones in any area of the school grounds beyond those detailed above.



	Sanction	Consequence for refusing to hand over the phone
1 st offence in the academic year	The phone is taken from the student at the time of the offence. A phone call / message is sent home to alert the parents of the confiscation. The phone is kept until the end of the week in the school office. The student attends an after-school detention on Friday and is given their phone back at the end of the detention.	The student is placed into Internal isolation until the phone is handed in. If the student refuses isolation they will be suspended for defiance for the remainder of the day. When the parent collects their child in order to serve the suspension, the phone must be handed to a member of staff. The phone is kept in the school office until Friday and is handed back to the student after the Friday detention.
2 nd offence in the academic year (and all further offences)	The phone is taken from the student at the time of the offence. A phone call / message is sent home to alert the parents of the confiscation. The phone is kept in the school office until the end of the half term. The student sits a detention on the last day of the half term. The parents come to school at the end of the detention to collect the phone and their child.	The student is placed into Internal isolation until the phone is handed in. If the student refuses isolation they will be suspended for defiance for the remainder of the day. When the parent collects their child in order to serve the suspension, the phone must be handed to a member of staff. The phone is kept in the school office until the last day of the term and is handed back to the student after the Friday detention.



Parents and guardians can be assured that they will still be able to contact their child in an emergency through main Reception. Likewise, if a student needs to contact home during the school day for an essential reason, they will be able to do so via main Reception.

Our policy for wired headphones and wireless blue tooth headphones remains unchanged in that students are only able to use these in the common room and in supervised study. If a student is seen with headphones in any other part of the school, these will be confiscated until 3pm of the same day, where the student can go to Main Reception to collect these items.

We appreciate that this represents a significant change in school policy. However, we firmly believe that this approach will support students in developing healthy habits, improving focus and making the most of every learning opportunity available to them. The Trust's policy for mobile phones, and other smart devices, will be updated to reflect these changes.

Thank you for your continued support in helping us create the best possible learning environment for our students.
